#### ARTFIELDS 2013:

Artfields is an arts festival for local practitioners across diverse disciplines. Last year the CTC presented a short scene from Macbeth as part of the Artfields performance night. This year we are performing another excerpt from a play, Embers, and we are also presenting a short play, Burqa as an Artfields satellite event. CTC actors will feature in the opening night celebrations.

### BURQA

Burqa is a new work written by local author Ian Nash, directed by Kate Stones and performed by Bairbre

Williams (who featured in *New Blood* last year as Beverley Dayton in *Love or Nearest Offer*) and Briega Young. It tells the story of a young Anglo Australian woman who has fallen in love with a Muslim man. Much to the dismay of her mother, she has decided to convert to Islam. She is found at home bent over a sewing machine making herself a jilbab and hijab (headscarf and gown). During the course of the play her mother argues feverishly to try to persuade her to change her mind. Eventually she hatches a cunning plan to thwart her daughters desires. It's a play about multiculturalism and mother/daughter conflict and competition...

Burqa will be performed at the Senior Citizens Centre, Mechanics Lane, Castlemaine at 8pm on Fri 23, Sat 24, Thu 29 and Fri 30 August. Tickets (\$10) will be available at the door. Please join us after the show for a free glass of wine and informal discussion of the work.

Ian Nash wrote and directed the trilogy *Challenged* for the CTC in 2010 which toured the One-Act Play Festivals in Regional Victoria, where it enjoyed considerable success. Part of the trilogy, *Tapestries* gained nominations in the Best Original Play, Best Director and Best Overall Production categories, whilst its

performers, Anna Davies and Bev Geldard achieved Best Actress awards at the Ballarat and Anglesea Festivals. Associate Professor Kim Durban from the University of Ballarat commented that *Tapestries* 'invokes the cry of the soul' and that Nash handled the subject matter with 'heart and compassion'.

Kate Stones is an actor and Secretary of The CTC. Burqa will constitute her debut as a solo director. She has performed for the CTC in New Blood (as Rosie Donahue in *The Donahue Sisters* for which she was nominated for Best Supporting Actress at the Kyneton One-Act Play Festival); as Toinette (and Musical Director) in *The Hypochondriac* (2011); and as Ida Rheingold in *Dirty Work at the Crossroads* (2010). She runs a small independent theatre company – The Red Room – with her partner Kenneth MacLeod. Kate co-directed and performed in their production *Emilie's Voltaire* which premiered at the 2011 Castlemaine Fringe Festival, and went on to tour to the Kyneton Town Hall, and to the Engine Room in Bendigo (July 2013). Kate is currently studying at Verve Studios in first year Professional Actors Studio.

#### **EMBERS**

Committee member Donna Stevens will direct an excerpt from *Embers* by Cameron Decent, as part of the Artfields Performance night on Friday 23 August at the Market Building on Mostyn Street, Castlemaine. The event is free. The raging fires that blistered Victoria's North East in 2003 ignited courage and heartbreak. Campion Decent's Embers is an authentic collage of stories from the community who fought to protect their lives, their homes, and their land. The monster blaze ripped through the bush at a speed no-one expected, claiming one life, 40 homes, 1.3 million hectares of land, and 9000 livestock. This production focused on the immediate and on-going hardships of a bush fire that may have been overshadowed if there had been a high death toll. Delving into the less publicized struggles people suffer in such a disaster created a far-reaching and more thorough insight into the tragedy. The scrapbook of stories is based on Decent's many interviews with residents of the region. Donna Steven played 'Lyn' in our recent production of Aftershocks. This experience ignited a keen interest in verbatim theatre, of which Embers is a very contemporary example. If you like lamingtons and firemen, you'll love this cheeky little excerpt from Embers!
